The Sacred Heart Schools Network

The Sacred Heart Schools Network was set up by the Provincial Council of the Irish-Scottish Province in 1997. For ten years the Network was supported by the Society of the Sacred Heart and was co-ordinated by Sister Aideen Kinlen assisted by Sister Mary Shiel.

The Network was restructured in 2007 and now the Network Office operates under the auspices of a Trust, the Sacred Heart Schools Network Ltd. The schools are:

THE FUNCTION OF THE NETWORK

The Network Office is located in Mount Anville House. The primary function of the Office is to provide services and support to Sacred Heart Schools as they work to implement the core values of Sacred Heart Education. The office provides in-service training and induction for staff of the various schools, organises annual conferences for Heads and Deputies, termly meetings for school co-ordinators and facilitates inter-school contact, visits and shared curricular projects.

Each school in the Network works on the implementation of the same Goal in the same school year. This is done in a spirit of co-operation and sharing which is underpinned by a common vision and a commitment to the philosophy of Sacred Heart Education. Creative and innovative ideas on how to make the implementation of the various Goals a reality are freely shared.

The present leaders of schools in the Network are motivated by the desire to ensure that future generations of young people can continue to be influenced by the values of Sacred Heart Education. They believe that the unity and solidarity which membership of the Network of Sacred Heart Schools provides is the framework to make this possible.

St. Joseph's Primary School Aberdeen, Scotland

St. Joseph's RC Primary is situated in the West-End of Aberdeen and is the largest of three Catholic schools in the city. The catchment area is large and includes pupils from a variety of social backgrounds.

The school was founded in 1896 in the form of a free school, St. Joseph's, and a Convent Day School, Our Lady's and, in 1897, the school was recognised by the government. In 1899 St. Andrew's Boarding School was opened. In 1904, Our Lady's Day School and St. Andrew's amalgamated to form Queen's Cross Convent School.

From 1907 to 1932, a Teacher Training Centre operated until this responsibility passed to Craiglockhart Training College in Edinburgh.

In 1970, St. Joseph's and Queen's Cross Primary amalgamated and, in 1971, the Secondary Day and Boarding School closed.

In 1973, St. Joseph's came completely under the management of the then Grampian Education Board.

St. Joseph's is now a Local Authority School, funded by the Scottish Government. We also host the Peripatetic Secondary RCRE Service which provides Catholic RE in our non-denominational Secondary Schools. There are no Catholic Secondary Schools in Aberdeen.

St. Catherine's College

Armagh, Ireland

In 1851 Mother Croft and five nuns arrived in Armagh and Sacred Heart Education came to the city. Their arrival was in response to Archbishop Cullen's vision expressed to Dr Kirby, President of the Irish College in Rome, and passed to Mother Scully in the Villa Lorte ... *'I have been speaking about getting over some ladies of the Sacred Heart to Armagh and I am told that it would be an excellent place for them. There is no school for young ladies in the entire province of Ulster. There is no Convent at all in Armagh and the town is large and respectable.'* The new community joined with the Armagh people in facing years of poverty and social, religious and cultural deprivation in the aftermath of the Great Famine. In those early years, the Sisters reached out, not only to the school-going population but, through evening classes, to the working women of the parish. The community lived in austere conditions but with great generosity, enterprise and adaptability their work, both in the boarding school and in the free school, was characterised by a clear educational vision and early success.

These visionary decisions have borne fruit and Saint Catherine's College/Coláiste Chaitríona has established itself as one of the largest schools and the premier and most innovative school in the North of Ireland. Saint Catherine's is a beacon on a hill radiating all that is best in our Irish Christian educational heritage. We look towards the future, confident in our own tradition and steadfast in our commitment to the guiding principles of Sacred Heart Education.

“ WHAT MAKES OUR SCHOOL UNIQUE

The importance of living out the Sacred Heart ethos permeates every aspect of the school's work. The result is an environment which promotes love of God and understanding of neighbour in a balanced and inter-connected learning experience. In Saint Catherine's there is an awareness that our high levels of academic, artistic, sporting and musical success and our Sacred Heart ethos are inextricably linked. Ours is a school which embraces inclusion, social justice, high expectations and high standards. We are the only post-primary school in the North of Ireland with an Irish Medium Unit which complements the richness and inclusivity of Saint Catherine's College/Coláiste Chaitríona.

Mount Saint Catherine's Armagh, Ireland

Mount Saint Catherine's is a modern school with a long tradition, first founded by the Society of the Sacred Heart in 1851, at the request of Archbishop Cullen. The present building opened in 1939 as an elementary school, at first serving both boys and girls. After a long period as a girls only school Mount Saint Catherine's recently regained co-educational status and will soon achieve equal numbers of boys and girls. We are a community school in an urban environment, centrally located in the ecclesiastical capital of Ireland with its rich history and tradition.

During the times of The Troubles, Mount Saint Catherine's was planted firmly at the centre of many difficult and traumatic events. However, the school remained a haven, where quality education and faith formation continued uninterrupted. We are centrally located on a large site that we share with Saint Catherine's College, on Mount Saint Catherine, from where we can see the whole city-scape of Armagh. The extensive environment of grass and mature trees creates an ideal outdoor classroom.

The school currently has its third lay principal in post and remains firmly committed to the values and ethos of the Society. This is enabled through our membership of the Network of Sacred Heart Schools in Scotland, Ireland and Malta. We value our close links with the other schools in the Network and also with international Sacred Heart Schools.

Mount St. Catherine's is characterised by its vibrant Sacred Heart Ethos being lived out in the challenging arena that is modern society. We have close parish and family links and enjoy an excellent reputation in the community as an open and inclusive school where a very high standard of education is offered in 'an atmosphere of trust and freedom'. Kilgraston School

Perthshire, Scotland

Kilgraston is set in 54 acres of parkland just south of Perth. The main building was constructed around 1800 by Francis Grant of Glenloch in the classic style of the Adam Brothers and was a private house until the First World War when it was requisitioned and used as a hospital. The stunning Georgian mansion now sits alongside outstanding modern facilities.

In 1930 the house and grounds were purchased by the Society of the Sacred Heart and opened as a school with 40 boarders. In 2000 the Society transferred Kilgraston into an independent Catholic Charitable Foundation but the school is still a member of the International Network of Sacred Heart Schools. As a Sacred Heart school, Kilgraston has always had a strong ecumenical tradition and warmly welcomes pupils from all denominations and other faiths.

Throughout the years Kilgraston has been extended and kept up to date with new developments. A new chapel was consecrated in 1961, and in 1987 the Barat Wing was opened housing classrooms on the Ground Floor and the Sixth Form Residential Accommodation upstairs. Kilgraston is keen to continually develop the facilities with recent investments in a 25 metre indoor swimming pool, full equestrian facilities on site and the development of a Centre for Sporting Excellence, with plans for new Hockey and Tennis academies in 2010.

As a boarding school, Kilgraston has a strong supporting community with outstanding pastoral care based on its Sacred Heart ethos. Kilgraston is also renowned for its academic excellence, with the girls consistently achieving some of the best results in Scotland to help them gain places in some of the finest Universities in the country. As well as having a strong emphasis on academia, Kilgraston encourages leadership, confidence, independence, integrity and an ambition to achieve and has something to inspire every young woman, from rock climbing and karate to photography and ceramics. Set in 54 acres of pristine Scottish parkland just south of Perth, Kilgraston is an ideal location for any girl.


Convent of the Sacred Heart School Foundation, Malta

The Sacred Heart School in Malta was founded in 1903 when seven religious of the Society, all of different nationalities, arrived from Rome after various Maltese families expressed their wish to give their children a Sacred Heart education as they had received themselves. The nuns were warmly welcomed and cared for by the Sisters of the Little Company of Mary (Blue Sisters). A close relationship between the two congregations developed and was maintained throughout the years. The school was set up at Villa Portelli, Sliema, but later moved to larger grounds close by where it still stands now. Though scarce at first, the school population gradually flourished, with a section for boys as well, though this was eventually phased out. The nuns wanted to offer the pupils a holistic education and a decision was taken to turn the day school into a boarding school. In 1968 the school became a day school once again. The Rosary School, also on the School Campus, established solely for the needy according to the wishes of the Foundress St. Madeleine Sophie Barat, was set up in 1904 and consequently was run free of charge. In World War 2 the school also served as a nursing home for wounded soldiers. In 1944 the first and only women's teacher training college on the island was opened on the school grounds. In 1954 the student teachers moved to a new building, Mater Admirabilis College of Education, which was officially inaugurated by Queen Elizabeth the Second. The school population today numbers 904.

“ WHAT MAKES OUR SCHOOL UNIQUE

The Sacred Heart International Network offers the school the unique opportunity to share, learn and keep itself well-informed regarding innovations both academically and socially world-wide. Ever since its foundation, the school has concentrated primarily on offering its pupils a holistic education, giving importance to character formation along with academic education. The school takes great pride in stressing the importance of teamwork, altruism and tolerance and this is kept in mind during the pupils' instruction in as many subjects as is possible. A good number of our past pupils are renowned contributors to Maltese society in philanthropic and artistic circles.

Mount Anville Primary School is a large girls' primary school with the Heart of Christ as our living inspiration. It is situated in Stillorgan, a suburb of Dublin. In Mount Anville Primary School, we seek to educate the whole person as a responsible member of society: confident of personal worth, actively living out Christ's call to know and share his love. The school community works together to make this aim a reality. The school fosters an atmosphere of freedom, openness and enquiry. We have a committed staff who implement the Sacred Heart ethos in every aspect of school life. All children arriving at MAPS bring with them a unique blend and wealth of experience, family relationships and parental aspirations. Our school, a place of growth, does everything to ensure these talents are recognised and developed. The school recognises the inherent worth, potential and dignity of each pupil. Each child is valued, cared for and respected. We celebrate each child's uniqueness and difference. Our learning is child-centred and experiential.

Mount Anville Montessori Junior School Dublin, Ireland

The Montessori Junior School is located alongside the Secondary School in the beautiful grounds of Mount Anville campus, and enjoys extensive shared facilities. The Montessori Department opened in 1954 with nine pupils, thanks to the generosity of Mount Anville past pupils, and is also indebted to the Society of the Sacred Heart, who further enhanced the facilities with the construction of a new building in 2000. This Department upholds the principles and philosophy of Maria Montessori, providing an authentic experience for the younger children. Well-prepared by this, they continue through the school availing of a wide and varied range of both curricular and extra-curricular activities.

The Junior Department has existed in a sense since 1865, when the school housed 'Junior Boarders', although it did not acquire its own separate campus space until 1984. As the girls progress through the school they broaden their knowledge and become self-reliant, open-minded learners, ready to cope with the opportunities ahead. Since 2009, the Montessori and Junior departments have been amalgamated. This is a significant moment in our school history, as we move forward together to build on our shared identity, strengthen our links, and provide a stimulating and holistic education that caters to the talents and abilities of each of our pupils.

We possess a shared understanding of both the unity of the school community and the diversity of its children. A calm, safe, nurturing environment prevails throughout our school, leading to the whole-hearted engagement of both pupils and staff, who create in turn the ideal atmosphere for teaching, learning, and mutual respect. Mount Anville Secondary School Dublin, Ireland

Mount Anville Secondary School is a Catholic, voluntary fee-paying school for girls between the ages of 12 and 18. Founded in Glasnevin as a boarding school in 1853, the school transferred southside in 1865 when the Society purchased Mount Anville from the eminent Irishman, William Dargan. Over a period of twenty-five years, the Boarding School closed and pupils from the Sacred Heart Schools at Leeson St. and Monkstown transferred to the site at Mount Anville. On 25th May 2007, the Feast of St. Madeleine Sophie, the Society of the Sacred Heart transferred the Trusteeship of the school to the Mount Anville Sacred Heart Education Trust. Under a lay management team and staff, the founding vision of St. Madeleine Sophie continues to inform and inspire the Sacred Heart philosophy of education at Mount Anville.

Mount Anville has established a reputation as one of the foremost educational establishments for girls in Ireland. The school's reputation as a centre for academic excellence is manifest in the outstanding results earned in the state examinations. A strong tradition in sports and the arts ensures that pupils benefit from a broad range of activities so that they leave as strong, confident women, with a well developed belief in their own potential. Our graduates make contributions across the entire spectrum of human endeavour - our alumnae include Mary Robinson (former President and UN High Commissioner), Catherine Day (Secretary General of the European Council) and Caroline Casey (Aisling Foundation).

“ WHAT MAKES OUR SCHOOL UNIQUE

Mount Anville cherishes, promotes and practises the Gospel values and our Eucharistic and Sacramental faith tradition. The school motto, In Te Confido, signals the centrality of a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. It is as young women of faith that our pupils join the adult world with a well developed belief in their abilities and their responsibility to act as agents of social justice, in the local and global community. Within a culture of hard work, positive learning experiences, a strong pastoral care system and a range of facilities to develop pupil gifts and talents in all areas, we strive to enable each pupil to grow to their full potential and live a life that will make a difference to society.

Primary School Roscrea Tipperary, Ireland

The Society of the Sacred Heart has been to the forefront in education in Roscrea since before the Famine. In fact, the first Sacred Heart Convent in Ireland was founded in the town in 1842. In 1992 the Society celebrated one hundred and fifty years of education in Roscrea.

Pupils are drawn from all areas of the town and its environs. The school is coeducational and caters for boys and girls from 4 to 12 years of age from a mixed socioeconomic background. A new building was provided for the primary school in 1962. Extensions have been added since including a facility for travelling families which was built in 1988. Travelling families are fully integrated into the mainstream classrooms and activities in the school.

The school recognises the uniqueness, inherent worth and dignity of each pupil. The pupils are encouraged to know themselves, accept their limitations and share their talents with others.

The educational programme is designed to help all pupils take their place as responsible citizens in an inter-dependent world whilst appreciating the difference in culture, race and religion.

The school seeks to develop a participative approach to the building of community. Pupils and their parents/guardians combine with the school staff to form a truly educational community. A new aspect to this community is the contribution from the increasing number of international pupils who attend the school.
